

<u>Apprenticeship on the Rise</u>




Indiana has secured a \$6.25 million federal grant to expand registered apprenticeships, boosting access to high-paying, in-demand careers. The funding—part of an \$84 million U.S. Department of Labor initiative—includes \$1.28 million to strengthen existing programs and \$4.9 million to launch new models and reduce barriers for employers.

Governor Mike Braun emphasized the state's commitment to workforce innovation, while DWD Commissioner Josh Richardson highlighted the impact on talent pipelines and employer needs. The Registered Apprenticeship Program (RAP) combines classroom instruction, on-the-job training, and mentorship in fields like construction, agriculture, and health sciences.

With 25,250 active apprentices in FY2025, Indiana is near the lead in apprenticeship growth —driven in part by a recent high school diploma redesign and new initiatives like CEMETS iLab Indiana, which expand youth work-based learning opportunities.




Resource Highlight: MCAA's Working at Heights Safety & Health Resources

Under what circumstances might a manager refer an employee to the EAP?

All employees can experience personal difficulties that can impact their performance at work. As a manager, you can suggest the EAP to an employee as a confidential resource provided at no charge.

What happens when employees call the EAP?

When employees call, they will speak with a GuidanceConsultantSM, a master's- or PhD-level counselor who will collect some general information and will talk with them about their needs. The GuidanceConsultantSM will provide the name of a counselor who can assist them.
